





bonus points, coupons or any other reward points.

Mechirat Chametz - Selling of Chametz

If one cannot completely remove all *chametz* food from the home during Pesach, Jewish law provides for the conditional sale of *chametz* to a non-Jew during Pesach. Upon the conclusion of Pesach, the *chametz* reverts to its original owner.



It is customary to make a contribution for *ma'ot hittin*, providing Pesach food for the needy, when selling *chametz*. Contributions should be made payable to the B'nai Israel Congregation Tzedakah Fund. Please return the form by noon on Friday April 11, in order to sell your *chametz*. *Chametz* will be repurchased at the conclusion of Pesach on Tuesday evening, April 22. B'dikat Chametz - The Search for Chametz, and Bi'ur Chametz-Burning Chametz

The search for leavened bread takes place on Sunday evening, April 13, after sunset. Members of the family, equipped with a lighted candle, go from room to room gathering crumbs of bread to ensure that the house has been cleansed of all *chametz*. Many families have a custom of hiding pieces of bread in order to guarantee that something may be found. Special *b'dikat chametz* sets (including a feather, spoon, candle, and instructions) are available from the Sisterhood Judaica Shop. *Chametz* is burned no later than 10:00 a.m. on Monday morning, April 14. This activity involves even the youngest members of the family.

Siyyum Bekhorim- Fast of the First Born

Monday morning, April 14, following the 7:15 a.m. minyan.

This observance reminds us that when the first-born of Egypt were slain during the Tenth Plague, the Israelite first-born were saved. It is incumbent upon first-born Jewish males to fast on the day before Pesach but, this responsibility is nullified when one joins in the completion of text study. All first-borns past bar/bat mitzvah age are therefore encouraged to join in this special tradition.

Following the morning service and the study session, we will join in a *seudat mitzvah*, a festive meal, provided through the courtesy of Micki and Lowell Gordon.


