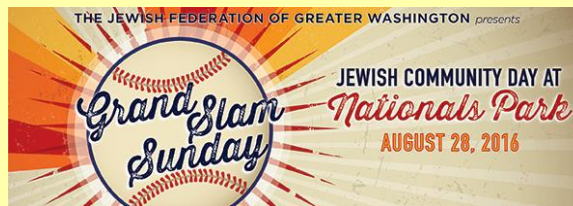

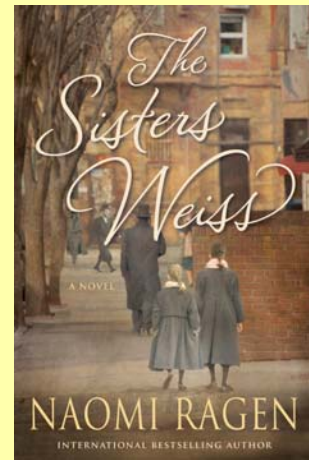

## L.I.F.E. LECTURE SERIES

*The Brandeis Legacy: Reflections on the 100th Anniversary of His Appointment to the Supreme Court*

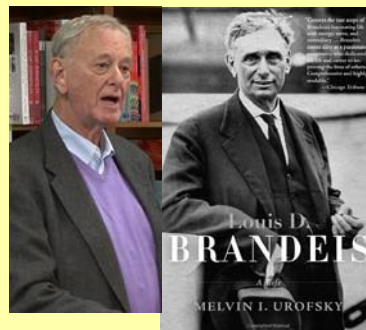

*This program is presented in partnership with the Foundation for Jewish Studies and the Jewish Historical Society of Greater Washington.*

It is now 100 years since Louis D. Brandeis was confirmed as an associate justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, and three-quarters of a century since his death. Yet his ideas and achievements continue to influence our lives today. His activities as a lawyer, a reformer, and a Zionist are as relevant today as they were in his lifetime, and his jurisprudence-especially in the areas of free speech and privacy-is still cited in contemporary court decisions. Dr. Urofsky looks briefly at Brandeis's career in law, reform, and Zionism, and devotes the bulk of his lecture to the continuing importance of Justice Brandeis's constitutional ideas.



Among the more than 50 books he has either written or edited are seven volumes of the Letters of Louis D. Brandeis (with David W. Levy); American Zionism from Herzl to the Holocaust (1975); and Louis D. Brandeis: A Life (2009). Signed copies of Louis D. Brandeis: A Life will be available for purchase following the lecture.

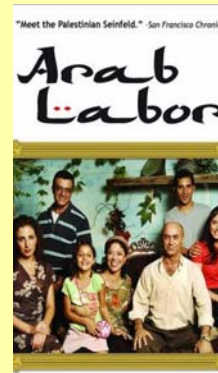

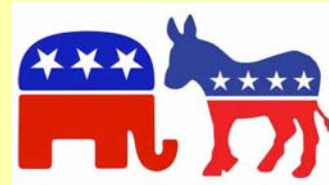

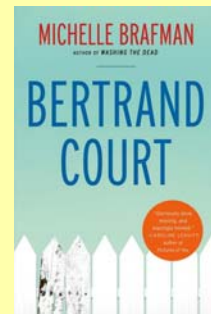
